Prior to joining the company, Lee was vice president and general manager of EnviroTech Molded Products (1995 to 1997). He was general manager of EnviroTech Rubber Engineering from 1993 to 1995 and vice president of finance for BGA International from 1991 to 1993.

Kevin Andrews is CFO and has been with the company since August 1995. Prior to joining the company, Kevin served as corporate development and finance manager for Moorco International, a supplier of fluid measurement and pressure control products (November 1993 to June 1995). Kevin was finance manager for the EnviroTech operating group from 1991 to 1993.

Mel Carter is the vice president of business development and has been with the company since August 1995.
